Dear Coyote Families,

I hope that you had a wonderful weekend. While we did not make it up to the mountains this weekend, it continues to snow which is great news for skiers and snowboarders! Make sure you take advantage before spring finally comes! It is just around the corner.

All of the sudden we have a number of important happenings at Sunset Ranch. Please check the calendar below for important information on our Pennies for Patients charity campaign, upcoming spring conferences, Book Fair, and Family STEM night!

I also want to update you on an important new curricular program we will be starting this week. It is a proactive bullying prevention program (BPP) that will be taught to ALL students in grades K-6. Similar to our current school wide rules expectations, the new BPP is proactive and teaches students how to act when BEFORE they encounter bullying situations not AFTER. Students will be taught a lesson each week for the next six weeks and concepts will be reinforced at our weekly assemblies. Also, the last five years have seen the word "bullying" become a catch-all for any conflict between students. I want to clarify the definition so that we are all on the same page when we talk about this particular issue:

"Bullying is defined as unwanted, aggressive behavior among students that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. Bullying includes actions such as making threats, spreading rumors, attacking someone physically or verbally, or digitally, and/or excluding someone from a group on purpose. The behavior is repeated or has the potential to be repeated, over time."

Please note that bullying occurs in one direction from a person with real or perceived power. It is not bidirectional as many school issues often are. It also involves actions *over time* and is not a term used to describe a single incident. By having a shared definition of what bullying is, it will help all of us better identify true bullying behavior and deal with it quickly and appropriately.


